Founder of the Philadelphia Dance Company (PHILADANCO) and the Philadelphia School of Dance Arts, Joan Myers Brown's personal and professional history reflects the hardships and the accomplishments of African Americans in the artistic and social developments through the twentieth and into the new millennium. Dixon Gottschild uses Brown's career as the fulcrum to leverage an exploration of the connection between performance, society, and race, exploring a concert dance tradition that has had no voice to tell its story. Brown's background and richly contoured biography are object lessons in survival—a true American narrative.

Brenda Dixon Gottschild is Professor Emerita of Dance Studies at Temple University and a former consultant/writer for *Dance Magazine*. She is the author of *Digging the Africanist Presence in American Performance*, *Waltzing in the Dark*, and *The Black Dancing Body*.

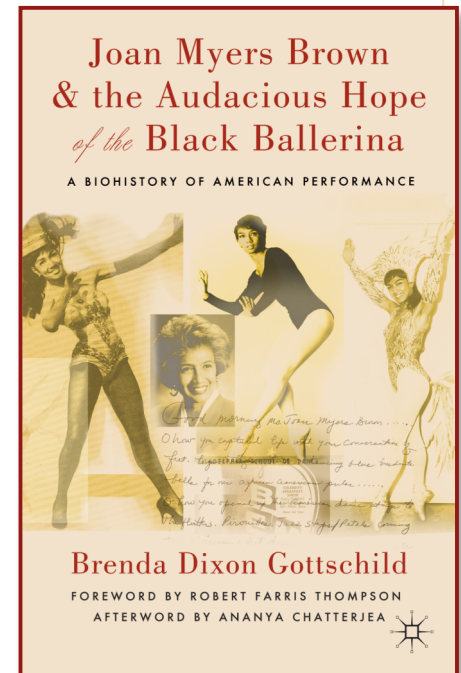
